Major events

4 – 5 September Bristol International Festival Of Kites And Air Creations Ashton Court Estate

In 2010 the Kite Festival is promising an action packed aerial extravaganza. This will feature spectacular flying displays, kite fighting battles, breathtaking synchronised routines flown to music and awesome power kites as well as colourful ground-based inflatables.

5 September Bristol Half Marathon 2010 Starts at Anchor Road

One of the UK's leading road races with over 15,000 entries. The attractive, sea-level course takes in the old city, scenic Harbourside and the stunning Avon Gorge and offers great potential for fast times and personal bests.
